#### Uniform

Please will you ensure that your child has the correct PE kit? We are seeing an increase of incorrect uniform for PE.

- White school or plain t-shirt (no sports tops or labels)
- Navy shorts
- Plimsolls and outdoor trainers
- Plain navy jogging bottoms may be worn if PE is outside

Long hair should be tied back, watches and earrings removed. If earrings can't be removed they need to be covered with tape.

We have also seen an increase in boys wearing sports trainer style shoes as their school shoes. I have mentioned this before in previous newsletters and appreciate those parents who have supported school in ensuring their children wear the correct school shoes. Adhering to uniform is something that children should be encouraged to do in preparation for secondary school.

School shoes should be worn to school everyday even on PE days. The children will change into trainers along with their PE kit.
