## **South Tyneside Homes**

We have had a request from South Tyneside Homes Welfare support officer, Heather Wake, to ask if it is possible to share information with them regarding the isolation of a class or year group bubble.

Heather's team administer the Track and Trace "Isolation support grant" on behalf of South Tyneside Council.

Where children are having to isolate as a contact from a bubble their parents who have to take time off work are able to claim a grant (subject to eligibility).

As part of the criteria, Heather's team has to verify with the school that the bubble has been sent home. If the information isn't shared the parent may not get the grant.

If you are applying for this grant, please let us know and with your permission we will confirm with South Tyneside Homes that your child has had to self-isolate.
