## Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

Some children in our school have been identified as having a special educational need or disability that may require additional support. If this is the case we will provide a personalised support plan and modify the national curriculum to make sure that all pupils are provided with relevant and appropriately challenging work at each key stage.

Mrs Blackwood is our SEND Co-ordinator in school she works in partnership with parents/carers, to ensure these needs are identified and plans developed to meet them.

Parents/carers will be fully informed and encouraged to be actively involved in a working partnership with School. We will liaise effectively with all outside agencies necessary to further address the needs of the child.

# Safeguarding

Safeguarding our pupils is our number one priority. We are a listening school and staff are trained in Safeguarding procedures. We have Designated Safeguarding Leads in school including our Headteacher. All school staff have undertaken training in safeguarding and child protection.

As a school we work closely with South Tyneside, and Clennell Education Solutions Safeguarding teams. We follow the guidance of 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' and working together to safeguard children. We regulary update our safeguarding procedures ensuring our school is a safe and secure environment for all. All staff are DBS checked before they can work in school.

#### The School Day

Our school day begins at 8.55am. The yard is supervised from 8.45am onwards and parents are kindly requested to drop children off at the gate when a member of staff is on duty.

Lunch break is 11.55am - 1.15pm for Infants 11.55am - 1.00pm for Juniors

The day ends at 3.30pm for all children.

## **School Uniform**

The wearing of a school uniform gives pupils a sense of belonging to the school community and encourages high standards in presentation. This in turn impacts favourably on both behaviour and attitudes. Our uniform consists of:

- White polo shirt
- Navy sweatshirt, tank top or cardigan
- Grey skirt or school style grey trouser
- Black school shoes (not trainers)

- White PE t-shirt
- Navy PE shorts
- Plain navy jogging bottoms
- Plimsolls and outdoor trainers

#### **Extra Curricular Activities**

A variety of after school clubs are on offer for example multi-sport, football, dance and show class. We work closely with South Tyneside Schools Sports Partnership to provide access to a wid-range of sporting events.

#### **Educational Visits**

All classes take part in an educational visit at least once per term. These are usually linked to the topic the children are studying in class.

We also have regularly visitors to school to bring learning to life. These have included charities, emergency services and people of different faiths. We are always keen for parents to come in to school and share their life experiences with us.

# **Family Support**

The support that families can offer children at home is invaluable and can make a huge difference to their progress. Children of all ages receive homework each week and are expected to complete this on time.

Research has found that home reading has the greatest direct effect on performance in school, reading at home is absolutely crucial for all children. We are incredibly committed at St Gregory's to ensuring every child leaves school with the ability to read.
